In addition, our urban innovation school in Oak Cliff serves children ages 3 through 5th grade. With an emphasis on innovation, collaboration and training, Momentous Institute offers a truly dynamic work environment.

Role:

Momentous Institute is seeking a clinician to work with children and families in a variety of treatment modalities including group, individual and family therapy. This clinician will support the work with clients across Therapeutic Services at Momentous Institute. At least 50% of this clinician's time will be spent within our **Huddle-Up Group Program**, an experiential, multi-family, afterschool and summer program for pre-teens and teens (ages 8-15) and their families presenting with significant social and emotional health issues. This individual may also participate in Huddle-Up facilitated community groups in Elementary and Middle Schools and at Community Centers. In addition to the group work within Huddle Up, this role will provide therapy for clients seeking more individualized services with Momentous Institute. This may include intake evaluations, individual or family therapy with children and adults.

Responsibilities:

- Assist with intake screenings for potential clients referred to therapy at Momentous Institute, including the Huddle-Up program
- Provide group therapy to participants in Huddle Up programming in house and in the community
- Attend all planning meetings for Huddle Up Programming
- Provide individual and/or family therapy.
- Provide casework to families participating in therapy, including phone calls, parent or school consultations, referrals, and coordination of care.
- Maintain thorough and timely case notes
- Performs other duties as assigned by management and supervisor.

Qualifications:

- Texas licensed therapist; or licensed eligible (LPC, LCSW, LMFT). If licensed eligible, supervision will be provided for LPC and LCSW interns.
- Fluent in both English and Spanish required
- A minimum of two years' experience working with children and families
- Experience working with groups
- Strategic thinker that supports program development
- Excellent communication skills – verbal and written
- Excellent interpersonal skills and experience working in a team based setting.
- Ability to receive feedback and open to self-reflection
- Ability to work with clients and colleagues of diverse backgrounds.

We are seeking professionals who hold a strong posture of respectfulness, integrity, initiative, energy, enthusiasm, flexibility, ability to receive feedback, and a sense of humor.
