## Launch Clinical Group Coordinator

**Reports to:** Director of Group Programming and Community Outreach

**Employment Status:** Full Time, Exempt

Momentous Institute, founded by Salesmanship Club of Dallas in 1920, exists to build and repair social emotional health with children, families, and communities. Each year, we partner with over 5,500 children and family members through innovative education and therapeutic services. The organization also invests in research and training, including the annual *Changing the Odds* conference, to reach far more children than could ever be seen directly. Our mental health team is committed to offering services that are systemic, trauma-informed, and include brain and strengths-based perspectives. Services are offered on a sliding scale and no family is ever turned away for an inability to pay. Momentous Institute offers a truly dynamic work environment where therapy can unfold in collaboration with the family, without the need to bill or justify services to insurance companies. We are seeking an experienced, licensed mental health clinician to join our collaborative clinical team.

**Role:** The Clinical Coordinator, will Coordinate and implement clinical programming of Launch – a group therapy program for young children presenting with significant behaviors of dysregulation.

### **Responsibilities:**

- Provide programming for children and their families enrolled in Launch. This includes but not limited to, the following:
  - Support screening of referrals to Launch
  - Develop and implement individual treatment plans
  - Work in collaboration with Launch Coordinator to support programming.
  - Lead and conduct regular team clinical debriefings
  - Provide case management to clients in program, including family consultations as needed
  - Provide consultations to systems in which clients are functioning (e.g., schools, affiliated partner agencies)
- Supervise trainees participating in Launch programming. This may include individual supervision in addition to team debriefings
- Support professional development of inter-disciplinary team of professionals responsible for programming
- Collaborate with community partners via consultation and trainings as necessary
- Maintain all appropriate documentation and record keeping.
- In addition to holding the clinical needs of families participating in Launch, this position will also provide services to children and families seeking individualized therapy at Momentous Institute. This may include play, individual, family or group therapy
- Program development that considers direct service goals, outcomes, innovation, and opportunities for program sharing
- Work closely with program director to weave direct service with program sharing in a way that generates growth and creativity. This may include consultation to schools and other systems who may benefit from a deeper understanding of postures and interventions used in Launch program
- Support meaningful Salesmanship Club member involvement as needed
- Perform other duties as assigned by leadership

## **Qualifications:**

- Master's degree in behavioral sciences from an accredited university with a Texas license to practice therapy (e.g., LPC, LCSW) with approval to supervise from governing Board (varies by discipline)
- A minimum of three years' experience working with young children and families
- Registered Play Therapist or training in play therapy/therapeutic play
- Experience with parent-child therapy interventions such as CPRT, theraplay, etc.
- Proficiency in adapting to and responding to child dysregulation/behavior issues
- Strategic thinker that supports program development
- Able to provide services on some evenings (5 to 7 PM)
- Excellent communication skills – verbal and written
- Excellent interpersonal and leadership and management skills
- Ability to work with clients and colleagues of diverse ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds
- Values self-reflection and open discussion of clinical work with colleagues

## **Physical Demands:**

- Constantly, we use stairs in the building, stairs in the playground and climb the leaf ladder in the playground, step stool to reach higher storage areas
